

Primary Vote Planner Guide

Absentee Ballot

- Fill out your absentee ballot and mail to your county clerk's office. You can find the address by visiting voteidaho.gov. It **MUST** reach the clerk's office by May 19, so mail yours by May 12 to be safe.
- Missed the mailing window? Take your ballot to your polling place or switch to in-person voting.

Early Voting

- Check your county clerk's website to see where you can vote early (not all counties offer early voting).
- Know which primary ballot you want (and are eligible) to request. Anybody can vote in the Democratic primary, but you must be a registered Republican or unaffiliated to vote in the Republican primary.

In-Person Voting

- Check your polling location on voteidaho.gov to make sure it hasn't moved.
- Select a time to vote and make a backup plan! Polls are open from 8 a.m.-8 p.m. local time.
- Know which primary ballot you want (and are eligible) to request. Anybody can vote in the Democratic primary, but you must be a registered Republican or unaffiliated to vote in the Republican primary.
