This presentation will give educators a basic understanding of the functions of behavior. There will be a focus on behavior terminology and basic behavioral principles. When the functions of behavior are determined, it is easier to use Positive Behavior Support (PBS) in order to develop effective replacement behaviors and behavior interventions for students with or without disabilities.

Educators will learn how the environment affects behavior, and how to brainstorm ways to help make environmental changes that support appropriate behavior.

Functional Assessment Interviews will also be covered. The FAI includes using informal interviews to help understand the setting events that impact student behavior.

Functional Behavior Assessments will be discussed, allowing teachers to find ways to collect data that help find the correct interventions that will create positive impact.

Educators will learn how to develop PBS plans and how to teach behavior skills and use the correct methods of reinforcement.
